Miner is a former Colonel in the United States Air Force (USAF), a position he held until his retirement in 2020. While in the USAF he served as the commander of five organizations. He had the honor and privilege of leading the air forces' premier global airborne contingency response unit, nuclear security for the nation's largest bomber wing, and protection for Joint Base Langley-Eustis and NASA, Virginia.

In 2016 as a Commanding Colonel, he was honored to lead Intelligence, Law Enforcement, Anti-Terrorism, Security, and Logistics for Joint Base San Antonio, the largest military installation in the Department of Defense, while also serving as the Garrison Commander for Joint Base San Antonio's – Randolph Air Force Base.
